Unlocking Potential: Investigating the Feasibility of Unconditional Cash Transfers to Boost Labour Market Participation Among KZN's Unemployed Youth

ABOUT THE REPORT: South Africa's youth face some of the highest unemployment rates globally, with barriers such as high job-seeking costs and lack of capital for self-employment. To test new approaches, the PMBEJD, in partnership with Misereor, piloted a two-year Unconditional Cash Transfer project. One hundred unemployed TVET graduates around Pietermaritzburg received R2000 per month for 24 months (value deliberately set above the upper-bound poverty line). The main research question which guided the project was, "Does an unconditional cash transfer of R2000 per month, for 24 months, provided to unemployed youth, who completed post-school education or training, lead to them creating economic livelihoods or increase their participation in the formal or informal labour market?"

By end of project:

- 74% became economically active through employment, self-employment, or both.
- Even six months after transfers ended, most remained engaged, though sustainability challenges were noted.

The report highlights findings on how unconditional cash transfers improved labour market entry, household security, and dignity—and sets out recommendations for future policy considerations.
